Applications can be made via the website below, where there is also further information regarding the process.

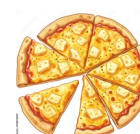

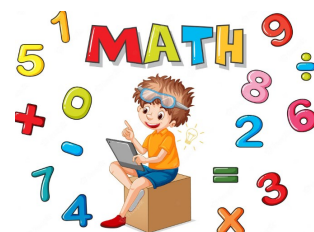
