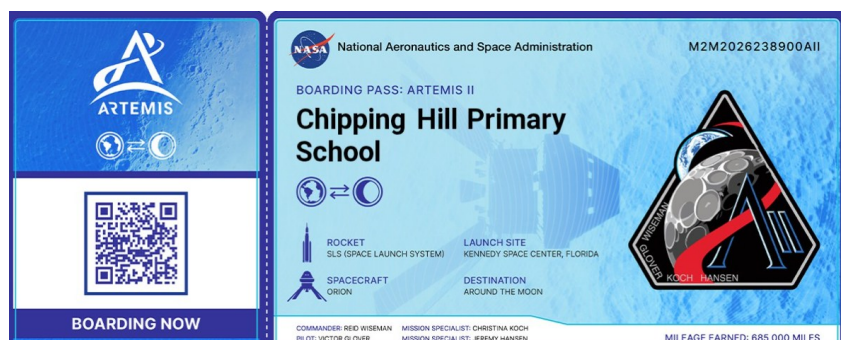

## Medicines

A reminder regarding prescribed drugs for children attending school;

- Parents should bring medicine to the office where they will be required to fill in a form stating details, dosage and all necessary information.
- Only medicines needing 4 or more doses per day will be given at school. Medicines requiring 3 doses should be given at home - at breakfast time, after school and at bedtime (the only exception would be if a child was attending Super Supper Club).
- We can only accept medicines that have been prescribed by a doctor, dentist, nurse prescriber or pharmacist prescriber. Medicines should always be provided in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and include the prescriber's instructions for administration.
- Parents and Carers should make arrangements to collect the medicine from the school office at the end of the day unless alternative arrangements are made with the school staff. Medicines will not be handed to a child to bring home.
- Non prescribed drugs: The school is unable to administer any non-prescribed drugs unless it has been discussed and agreed with the school office.

It is the responsibility of parents and carers to ensure that, where necessary, you have checked the allergen list and ordered an appropriate meal accordingly. This also applies to ensuring that any children with any other dietary requirements are also ordered the correct meal (i.e. vegetarians and those with religious beliefs). There will be no charge for those entitled to Universal Free School Meals (reception, Year 1 and Year 2) and to those children in other year groups entitled to means tested free school meals. The charge for all other children is £2.20, payment can be made online or by cash.

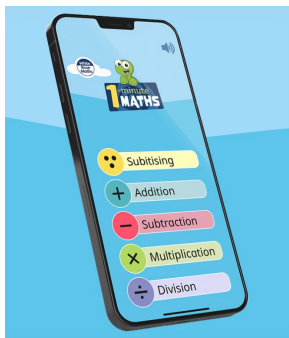
## Year 5 - Library Trip
