Swimming 2023/24

Schools are now required to publish how many Year 6 pupils have met the national curriculum requirements relating to swimming and water safety. The Year 6 cohort 2023/24 53/58 children met the national curriculum requirement to swim confidently over a distance of 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and also perform safe self-rescue.
